### LIGHT Film Series

LIGHT will be presenting a series of films (on video) with spiritual themes once a month, starting in February, with discussion following.

*Travellers and Magicians*

Written and directed by the Tibetan Buddhist Rinpoche Khyentse Norbu, this film spins two parallel stories that deliver one message: happiness can be attained simply by being in the present moment.

**Sunday, March 19 - 7:00 p.m.**

*Ram Dass: Fierce Grace*

Once a symbol of '60s counterculture and psychedelic drug use, Ram Dass has since become a renowned speaker and author on the topics of aging, spirituality and overcoming the mistakes of the past. This documentary chronicles the journey of Ram Dass from his affiliations with LSD advocate Timothy Leary, through his relationship with his guru Neem Karoli Baba, to his endeavour to continue remaking himself after his stroke in 1997.

**Sunday, April 23 - 7:00 p.m.**

*Born Into Brothels*

Winner of the 2004 Academy Award for Best Documentary, *Born Into Brothels* is about the inspiring non-profit foundation Kids With Cameras. Most of the images in this film were created by the children of prostitutes, and capture the intimacy and colour of everyday life in the overpopulated sections of Calcutta.

*Say Amen, Somebody*

An exuberant documentary spotlighting the special world of American gospel music, containing performances by and interviews with many of the giants of this musical genre.


**Tuesday, April 4**

# The Fall Season In Review

LIGHT presented a busy and engaging season of events in the Fall of 2005, that were broadly attended and well received.

Beginning in September, the first of our Film Series was *What the Bleep Do We Know!?*, a timely and controversial film exploring the quantum field which underlies fundamental questions of relationship, life force, creativity and purpose, through the eyes of the female protagonist. A lively and informative discussion following the movie was facilitated by LIGHT member Doug Tataryn.

On October 1, LIGHT presented a workshop on "Spirituality and Simplicity", co-facilitated by Mark Burch and Eszti Nagy. This full day was an initial discovery of the way that concern for material possessions can limit our ability to learn the lessons life has to offer about our own strengths and our essential links to others. This workshop will be repeated in a half-day format in the future.

The first of the fall Lecture Series was a presentation in October by well-known local artist Robert Pasternak, on "Symbolism and Spirituality". Using his own art as examples, Robert covered the use of symbolism in art as a means of conveying deeper significance, or to harken back to a shared, more primitive history. An audience of about 35 was engaged by this thorough presentation.

October events continued with the film *Enlightenment Guaranteed*. This German film follows the path of two brothers entering a Zen monastery with very different results. "As funny as it is nourishing," said Kevin Thomas of the *Los Angeles Times*, a sentiment reflected during the enthusiastic discussion following the film, conducted by Tim Freeman.

Carol Ann Gotch, best known for her co-founding of Inscapes, a group which uses the Enneagram for personal development, spoke on "Conversation and Community" in early November. Presented in a roundtable style, Carol Ann challenged attendees to use the opportunity to get to know more about their table-mates through three questions. Some liked it, some found it uncomfortable, but none were left unaffected.

Also in November, LIGHT screened the film *Koyaanisqatsi: Life Out of Balance*. This classic 1983 film, with a haunting soundtrack by Philip Glass, presented a kaleidoscopic series of images showing the artificial environments that separate us from the natural world. Based on Hopi concepts, this apocalyptic vision attempts to reveal the beauty of the beast in which we are immersed. The discussion following was facilitated by LIGHT board member Sharon Wisemyn.



The season wound up with Douglas Staley presenting "Sacred Gardens East and West," a lush and inviting multimedia exposition of the many types of gardens around the world, and the important symbols, plants and landscape designs incorporated within them. Charisma Restaurant was full that night, with many friends and members of LIGHT present.

The coming year's schedule promises to be just as exciting, with themes of poetry, astrology, the Tarot and other interesting topics (see page 1). We will continue to use the venues of Charisma Restaurant and Robert A. Steen C. C. The following five sections of the library are now open:


## Spiritual Films and Videos

A number of high quality DVDs and VHS videos are available, including films that have been featured in the LIGHT spiritual film series:

LIGHT has back sets and current issues of four important spiritual magazines and journals:


- *Gnosis* magazine, dedicated to the study of Western inner traditions through the exploration of esoteric, spiritual and occult paths
